The original is in the possession of the McBurney family in Cambridge, who are descendants of Dollie Rundall and her husband Brian McBurney. Dollie was the daughter of Col. Montie and Rosa Bickersteth Rundall. The McBurneys are also descendants of Ada Rundall, who married Thomas Edmonstone Charles.

BACK ROW, STANDING, LEFT TO RIGHT:

Col. Frank Montagu Rundall, C.B. D.S.O. O.B.E.
Born 18.5.1851. Died 25.4.1930. Known as Montie. Married Emily Rosa Bickersteth. Known as Rosa.

Ada Henrietta Rundall
Born 1848. Died 1932. She was referred to as 'Aunt Ada of Camberley' by John Wingate Rundall, son of John William Rundall. Married Thomas Edmonstone Charles M.D. L.L.D. I.M.S. on 29.1.1869.

Rev. John William Rundall. B.A. Cantab.
Born 26.2.1859. Died 31.7.1903. Known as Jack. Married Constance Ethel Wingate Pearse in 1891. He was Headmaster and proprietor of St. Ninian's School, Moffat, Dumfriesshire.

MIDDLE ROW, LEFT TO RIGHT:

Gen. Francis Hornblow Rundall C.S.I. R.E.
Born 1823 in Madras. Died 1908 in Moffat (where he is buried). Known as Frank. Married Fanny Ada Seton-Burn on 8.12.1846.

Fanny Ada Rundall (nee Seton-Burn)
Born 27.3.1826. Died 13.10.1889 at Thun, Switzerland. She is also buried there.

Katherine Laura Rundall
Born 17.8.1849. Died 1920s. She married Lt.Col. Eric Fraser Smith-Neill on 29.1.1869. She was referred to as 'Aunt Katy of Camberley' by John Wingate Rundall.

LEFT, SEATED ON FLOOR:

Mary Raby Rundall
Born 18.12.1860. Died 1935 (?). She married Rev. Frank Wingate Pearse on 21.4.1891. Frank and Mary took over St Ninian's School after the early death of John William. They appear to have been an extraordinary couple. To quote from the history of the school, "In the towering shadow of the Pearses, other masters loomed inevitably less large." In a biography of Iain Macleod, the late Tory Cabinet Minister, there are descriptions of this formidable but highly respected pair. Mary and her father's grave are side by side in Moffat cemetery. Interestingly the name Rundall is used on her headstone and below it refers to her as being the wife of the Rev. Frank Pearse. On the other side of F.H.R.'s grave there is a small cross dedicated to him by his grandchildren. Elsewhere in this beautiful cemetery is the damaged, tiny memorial to John Hermann Rundall, the first child of John William and Constance, who died in infancy.
